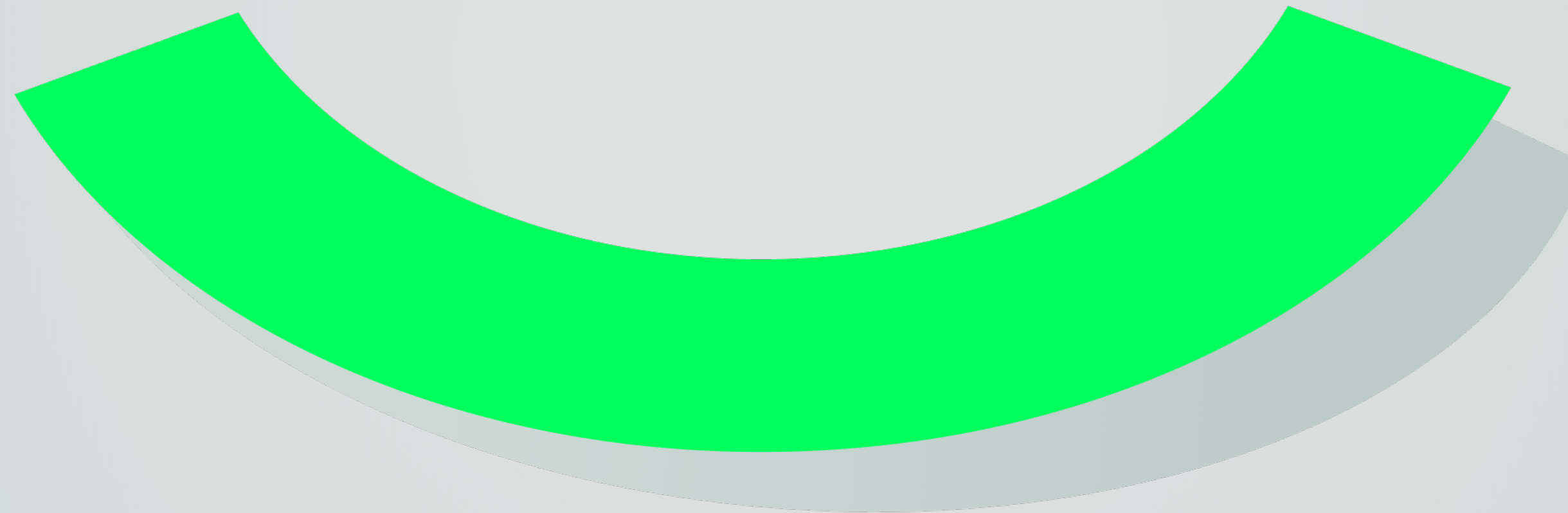

'I felt like an animal': Deaf woman wins suit against hospital for refusing to provide interpreter

A U.S. judge found Cleveland Clinic in contempt of court for refusing to provide interpreters to deaf people like Seminole Ridge teacher Rose Adams.

U.S. District Judge Rodolfo Ruiz socked the hospital giant with a \$16,000 fine after blasting it for dragging its feet on a promise to train staff about how best to treat deaf patients.

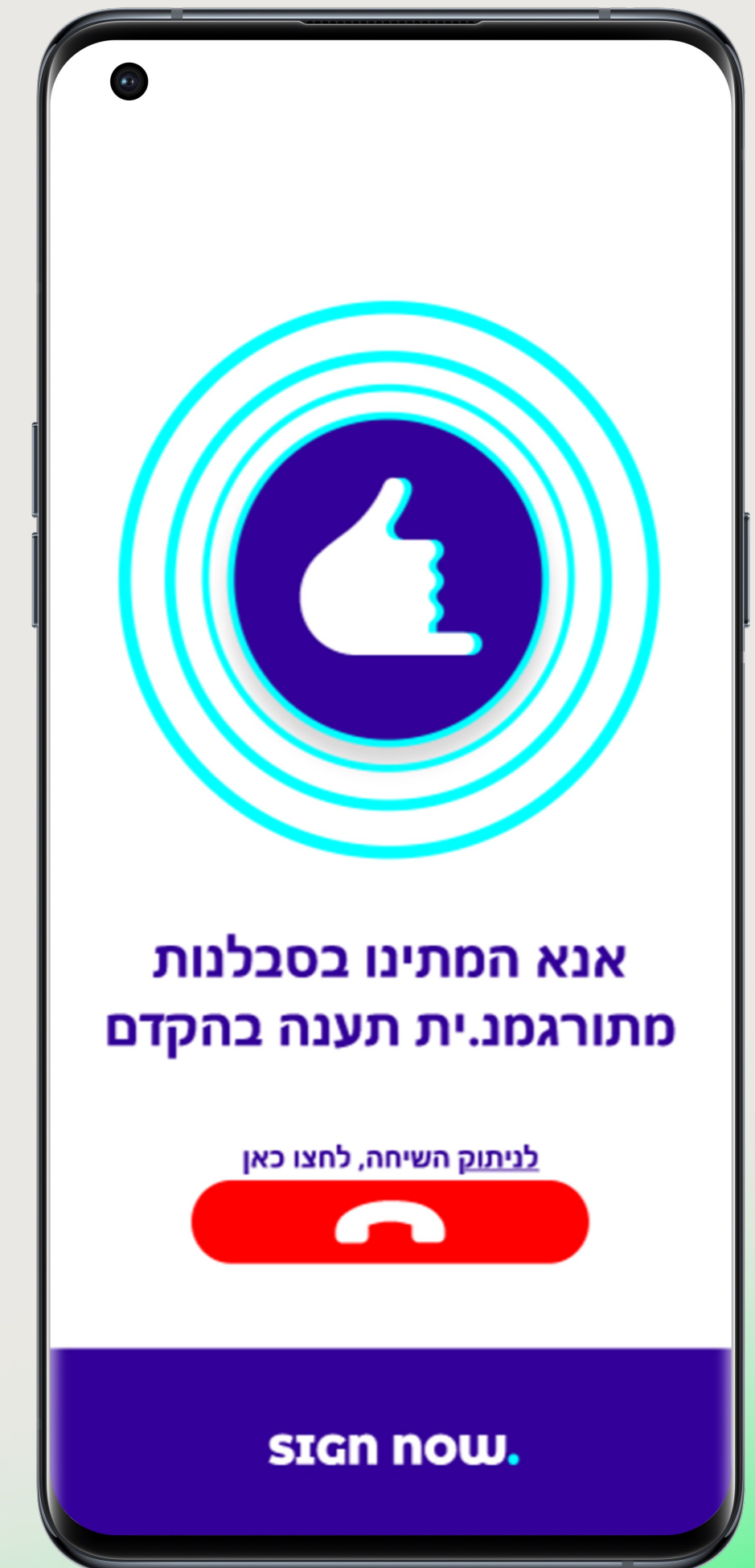
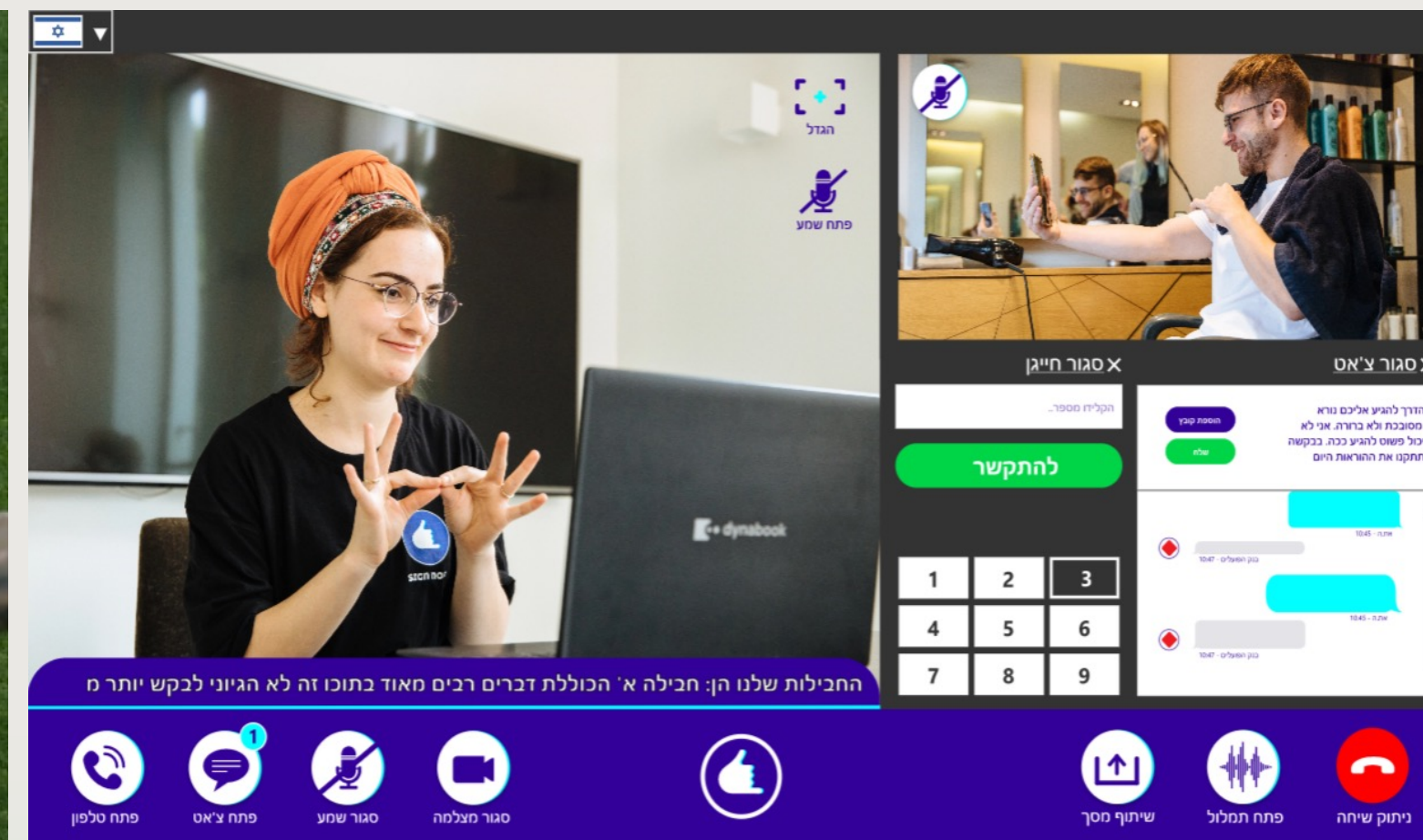
“The court finds it impossible that a health system entrusted with the care of millions of patients on an annual basis, and with revenues exceeding \$10 billion a year, is incapable of showing its employees a 15-minute video to help ensure that deaf patients are treated equitably when presenting at one of their facilities,” he wrote.

He ordered that it be fined \$1,000 a day until all workers were trained. Last month, after hospital officials said the training was complete, he order it to pay a \$16,000 fine. He also ordered it to pay Dietz’s \$22,000 bill for representing Adams.

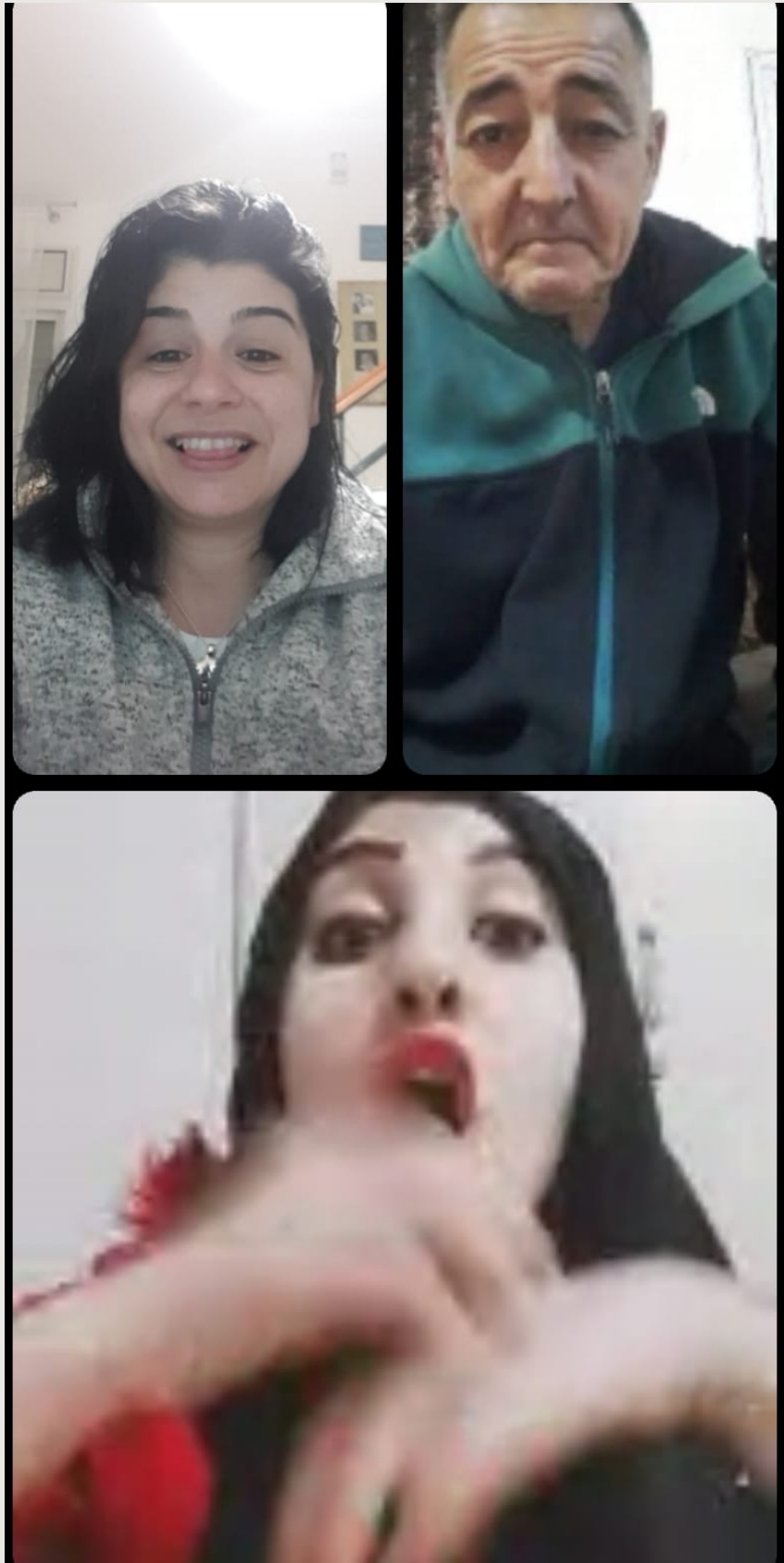

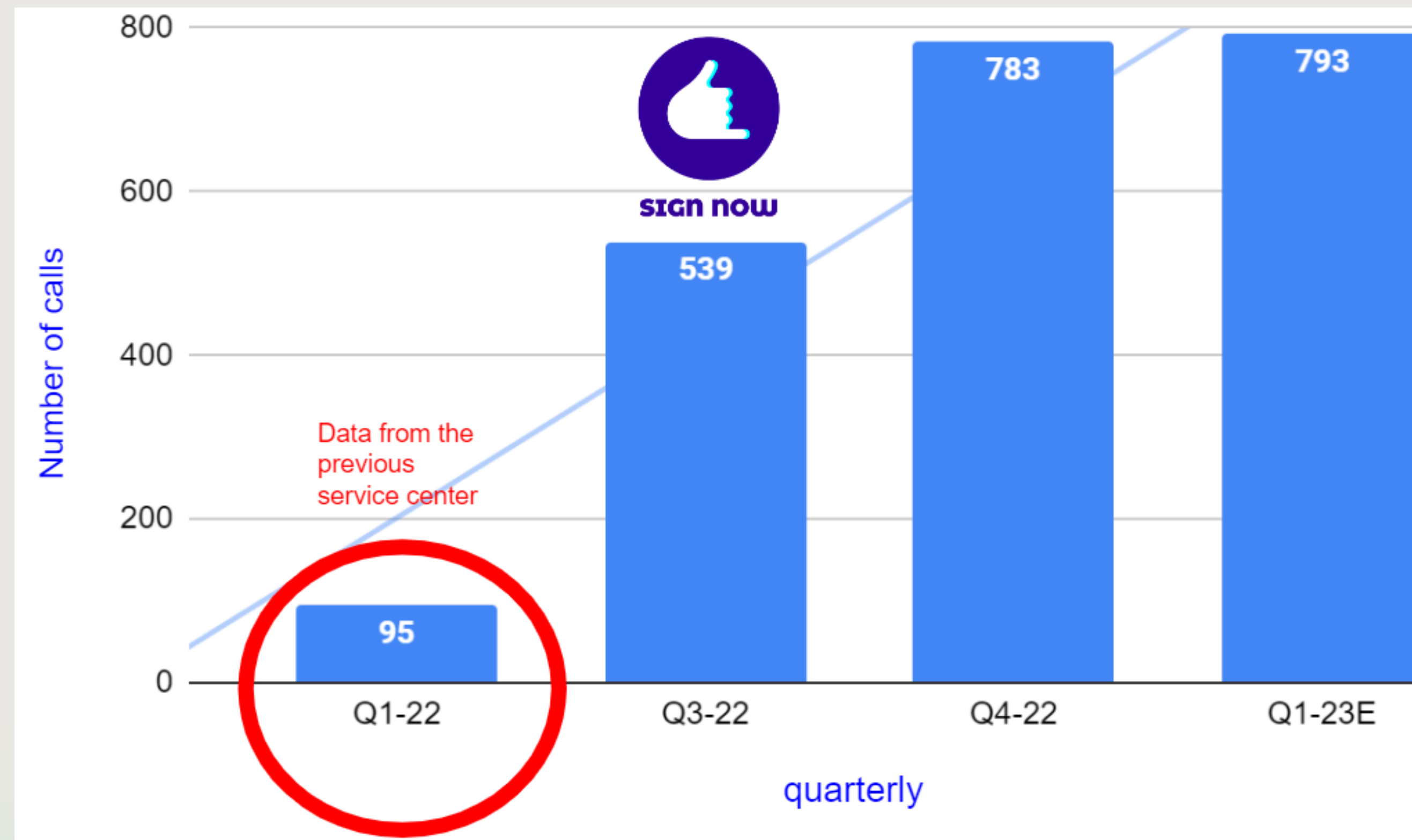
