

WHAT WE DO



Assessment, information management & analysis support

Provide support to the humanitarian coordination structure through assessments and analysis with OCHA, HCT, clusters, etc.





Rapid assessments in sudden-onset crises

Carry-out rapid assessments in crises to provide a basis for operational actors to plan and prioritize their response.



Humanitarian situation monitoring

Provide regular updates of the humanitarian situation by monitoring needs, service provision, market trends and access to markets, as well as using comparative vulnerability indicators to strengthen inter-sectorial prioritization and gap analysis.



Crisis-wide multi-sector assessments

Conduct crisis-wide multi-sector or sector-specific assessments to inform humanitarian milestones.

HOW WE DO IT

Secondary data review

Building on existing knowledge and information to better target research

Dissemination of information to aid actors

Dissemination of information to aid actors through a range of tailor-made products such as reports, profiles, briefs, presentations, situation overviews and factsheets, GIS analysis, interactive web-maps and online dashboards.



Primary data collection

Primary data collection (including in hard-to-reach areas) through dedicated teams of enumerators. encoders and analysers.



Remote-sensing and satellite imagery analysis

Leveraging techincal tools to improve the visibility of aid actors on sudden onset crises.

Facilitation and training of partners staff for joint assessment exercises

Building the capacity and data literacy of partners to reach shared understanding of a crisis.



Data analysis support

Data analysis support (including Joint analysis workshops) and facilitation of access to data.




