Although a very prevalent issue already, the crisis we are currently facing is more than ever highlighting how crucial an ecological transition is.

To address this major issue, the Oceanographic Institute of Monaco is willing to accompany the youngest generations -tomorrow's decision-makers- by providing them original keys for the understanding of the world they live in and its disruptions. Founded in 1906 by Prince Albert I<sup>er</sup> of Monaco, the Oceanographic Institute is a foundation dedicated to the understanding, the presentation and the preservation of marine biodiversity and environment, with a leading role in worldwide public awareness. Its power of attraction is unfailing: with 650, 000 visitors in 2019, the Museum of Monaco is considered one of the most visited scientific sites in Western Europe.

With the “**OCEANO POUR TOUS**” program, the Institute wishes to provide young schoolchildren with knowledge about the issues affecting the oceans and seas, related to climate change and human activities. The aim is to give them the tools to conceive creative solutions for the future, in accordance with the UN objectives for sustainable development.

As part of this initiative, 20 classes will be selected both in France and Monaco and supported by the Oceanographic Institute to implement an innovative project related to the ocean's protection, in coordination with the “eco-delegates” of each class. An emphasis will be put on priority education networks' schools. The call for projects is scheduled for spring 2022 and the first interventions for the 2022 Autumn session. Each class will receive 30 hours of distance guidance from the museum's teams, which may take the form of a documentation support, a pedagogical monitoring, and workshops. In the end, the contestants will have to present their project through a short video which will be submitted to a jury. The winning class will be awarded a free of charge stay at Monaco, supervised by the Institute's teams.

We ought to measure this impact with a regular follow-up, with a goal of 30 000 children reached per year.

- ✓ Contribute directly or indirectly to SDGs 4 (quality education with equity), 13 (climate change awareness) and 14 (conservation and sustainable use of oceans, seas, and marine resources).
- ✓ Opening a dialogue between generations to share perspectives and solutions for common objectives, in a civic-minded way.
- ✓ Creating new opportunities for the Oceanographic Institute to share its expertise in a practical and useful way, thus asserting its role as an international leader in the ocean scientific field.
