

Monaco's Commitment to Energy Transition Strengthened by the National Pact

The Principality of Monaco continues to advance its commitment to a sustainable future with the National Pact for Energy Transition. Launched by the Mission for Energy Transition (MET) in January 2018 and signed by H.S.H. Prince Albert II, this initiative seeks to unite residents, workers, businesses, institutions, and associations in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and enhancing energy efficiency across the Principality.

Signatories and Engagement

As of today, the National Pact boasts a significant number of signatories, including 143 entities (businesses, institutions, and associations) and 1181 individuals. This robust participation underscores Monaco's collective dedication to mitigating climate change and fostering sustainable practices.

The Pact's Framework

The National Pact is founded on a clear and actionable charter that outlines three primary axes for energy transition:

1. Mobility – Encouraging the use of eco-friendly transportation methods.

2. Waste Management – Promoting recycling and waste reduction.

3. Energy – Enhancing energy efficiency and adopting renewable energy sources.

Participants in the Pact commit to:

- Conducting a simplified greenhouse gas (GHG) emission assessment.
- Signing an electronic commitment charter.

- Selecting specific actions to implement within the following year to contribute to the Principality's sustainability goals.

For businesses and institutions, a detailed GHG assessment and the designation of an energy transition coordinator are mandatory.

Support and Monitoring

The MET provides continuous support through the Coach Carbone platform, which facilitates quick and easy adhesion to the Pact, event registration, and access to updated information and best practices. Each year, a progress review is conducted to evaluate the achievements and challenges faced by the participants.
