- women are never equal to men

- that education can wait but not marriage
- and last but not least that extreme violence is ordinary and normalized

To combat prejudices in school textbooks today, we need all of you to take a look at what children are taught. Are textbooks promoting outdated stereotypes? Perpetuating sexism and inequality? Making violence look normal?

The Women's Forum promotes actions that ensure that all educational systems act as levers for equality and gender equality throughout the world. For each school textbook that does not educate for equality, one more child reaches adulthood deprived of the essential values that we defend.
