Clonakilty Black Pudding – The story begins in the 1800s in Philip Harrington's butcher shop in Sovereign Street Clonakilty. Johanna O'Brien, a farmer's wife, from Sam's Cross wanted to subsidise the household income by making black pudding for Harrington's butcher shop. In the 1980s, Edward and Colette Twomey wanted to share the taste of Clonakilty. As business continued to grow, a brand new custombuilt production facility was opened in Clonakilty in October 2017. The new production facility also includes administration offices, new product development facilities and distribution.
