## Typical Formats of Inclusive and Social Entrepreneurship Training Schemes



### One-to-many

- Classroom training/ Course
- Workshop
- Masterclass
- Bootcamp



### One-to-one

- Coaching and mentoring
- Business consultancy



### **Online learning**

- Massive Open Online Course (MOOC)
- Online training courses
- E-learning portals



### Peer learning

- Peer coaching or mentoring
- On-the-job training



# Improving the effectiveness of inclusive and social entrepreneurship training

# 1. Tailor training content to target groups

E.g. based on *ex ante* evaluations and stakeholder consultations



# 2. Minimise barriers to access

E.g. location, hours, accessibility, lack of childcare

# 4. Use ongoing monitoring

Track key performance indicators and conduct regular impact evaluations



### 3. Engage stakeholders & local actors

Partner with targeted groups and organisations already provide services to them
